There's a slight change to the Spring Barn offer, but it will only affect families with a Compass Card holder under the age of two.

Compass Card holders get a 50 pence discount (so £5-£6 for under 14s, £6-£7 for over 14s, depending on day and season) There's no charge for under 2s. One parent carer goes free unless the child is under two and getting free entrance. In this case the carer pays the usual adult price.

early learning centre (elc – see page 20)

The offer at ELC remains the same – but the discount has been reduced from 20% to 10%.

Please note, you'll need to show your Compass Card at the performance to validate your discount.

What?

Brighton & Hove has an amazing range of museums, as well as the unique royal pleasure palace, the Royal Pavilion. Admission to Brighton Museum, Hove Museum and the Booth Museum is free, but there are entrance fees for the Royal Pavilion and Preston Manor and some exhibitions at Brighton Museum & Art Gallery and showing the Compass Card will ensure you get the best deal.

Children up to the age of 15 who live in the city already get free entrance to the Royal Pavilion and Preston Manor and to paid-for exhibitions at Brighton Museum & Art Gallery if they visit with an adult who also lives in Brighton & Hove. Carers of visitors with disabilities get in free too. However, showing the Compass Card also means 16-19 year olds get free entrance, and it ensures the accompanying adult is seen as a carer even if your child's special needs are not obvious.

The Royal Pavilion, built for the Prince Regent (later King George IV), is famed for its exotic appearance inside and out and is Brighton's most distinctive landmark. Preston Manor is an atmospheric Edwardian manor house, reputed to be the most haunted building in Brighton. And there's a great range of exhibitions at Brighton Museum & Art Gallery too!
