



## Compass Card Activities update, November 2014

### The Compass Card is for 20-24 year olds too!

Amaze is extending the Compass Card to include young people aged 20 to 24 (up till their 25th birthday). We'll be introducing the change in two phases:

1. From the end of November 2014, Amaze will be contacting young people who have had a Compass Card before (or their parent carer) and asking if they want to apply for a new Compass Card. They will be sent a young person's Compass Registration Form to complete. You don't need to do anything, but do email [compass@amazebrighton.org.uk](mailto:compass@amazebrighton.org.uk) or call the helpline on 01273 772289 if your contact details have changed.
2. From late February 2015, all young people with significant additional needs will be invited to apply for a Compass Card and Amaze will be telling everyone about the change.

Young people aged 20 to 24 with a Compass Card will only be able to go to some of the Compass Card Activities listed in this guide. Over time, we plan to introduce more Compass Card Activities for this age group. The following Compass Card Activities are currently open to 20-24 year olds:

- **Archery** (Adventure Unlimited - see page 4)
- **Art workshops** (Make Your Mark - see page 5)
- **Cinema** (autism-friendly screenings - see page 6)
- **Climbing** (Adventure Unlimited - see page 7)

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## NEW! Travel Training for 16-24s

### What?

Parents of young people can feel anxious about them travelling around the city independently – but wouldn't it be great if parents could join forces with their young person and help them learn to travel safely with the help of an experienced travel expert from the Grace Eyre Travel Buddy Project? Our new Travel Training Compass Card Activity will help you do just that. Families get helpful one-on-one training from Ben Gardiner, tailored to the young person's specific needs. If there's high demand for the training, over 18s will be prioritised. Ben also provides a rolling programme of free six week introductory courses to independent travel training for over 18s and parent carers (next starts Tuesday 6 January 2015).
