We're really excited about two developments for our SENDIASS helpline that we hope will cut the time you have to wait to speak to an adviser. We have a new helpline assistant, Boo Vaughan, who will be contacting people who have left messages to book them a scheduled callback with a trained SENDIASS adviser to discuss their issue in more detail. We're also trialling Live Chat on our website – which will give you another route to one of our SENDIASS advisers. The three-week Live Chat trial will begin on Mon 17 February and if it's successful we'll roll out the Live Chat service alongside our helpline this year.
