What is masking?

- hiding or suppressing parts of your autistic/ADHD self so you fit in with others, for example by not stimming or talking about your special interests
- saying you're okay when you're not, to avoid attention and blend in
- acting like other people to fit in and to avoid being spotlighted. For example, a person who seems sociable might just be wearing their "sociable mask". This is sometimes called camouflaging
- people pleasing doing things to make others happy even if you don't want to
- disguising the reasons for your behaviour by taking on a role like the class clown, the loner who doesn't care what anyone thinks, etc.

"Masking is when I wear a metaphorical mask that gives me the appearance of being neurotypical"

Amaze's guide to masking

Brighton & Hove Inclusion Support Service (BHISS) Autism team and the Brighton & Hove Hidden Children's Officer led a project earlier this year to produce a **leaflet about masking** for their local schools. It was co-produced with Amaze, PaCC, Seaside View, other teams from BHISS and with contributions from Brighton & Hove pupils.

Amaze asked if we could adapt the leaflet for parent carers and here is the end result which includes ideas on how to help your child/young person who is masking and how to approach their school or college for support. We worked with people with lived experience of masking and autism and ADHD to produce the leaflet.








How to claim PIP

In memory of Sinead Gillespie

Amaze is very sad to share news of the death of a much-loved colleague and Amaze parent, Sinead Gillespie. Parents of adult children may remember Sinead, who helped to develop and codeliver our **Insiders' Guide course** for parents of teenagers with SEND. Sinead remarried and moved to Somerset with her son Oliver several vears ago.

Sinead was a teacher, writer and performer and these skills, combined with her warmth and vivacity, made her a brilliant facilitator. She also contributed to our Through the Next Maze handbook for parents of teenagers and was a parent representative on the Brighton & Hove Learning Disability Partnership Board.

Sinead was passionate about trying to improve the transition to adulthood for young people and their families, and we will be forever grateful for the part she played in helping us develop our first services for young people with SEND.
