Spooky deals with autumn with i-go

Looking for frightfully fun activities this half term? Why not try the Spooky Halloween Trail at Smugglers, Hastings - carers go free. Step into a world of scales, fangs, and hisses with the RepTylers Halloween activity at Borde Hill, Haywards Heath, on Weds 25 October, or try one of their explosive experiment shows and slime

<u>making classes</u> on Tuesday 24 October. Activities/shows cost between £3-5 plus cost of admission. Or if you're brave enough, <u>explore the spooky tunnels</u> at Newhaven Fort by torchlight, free entry for an i-go cardholder and up to 4 carers can pay just £2.25.

True crime lovers may be interested in visiting the <u>true crime museum</u> in Hastings between Sun 22 October to Tues 31 October. Carer goes free and reduced price for 17 to 25's with an i-go card. Parent's discretion advised for entry for children under 13.

Looking for less spooky things to do? <u>Paradise Park</u> in Newhaven has a dinosaur safari, crazy golf, miniature railway, and loads more, and is offering 50% ticket price for i-go cardholders and up to five companions. Or to get more active, head to <u>Ninja Arena Eastbourne</u> for one of their SEN sessions on Sundays 5.15-6.15pm, these sessions have no music, loud announcements or flashing lights, and less people. 1 hour session costs £12, one carer goes free.
