Over the next two years, as part of the **South East Change Programme Partnership**, Brighton & Hove and East Sussex will be helping **test proposed reforms** from the government's SEND Improvement Plan, published in March 2023.


The training is free of charge, and will set you up with the right skills to become part of a close-knit team of parent carers supporting others on their SEND journeys.

# Support for families around neurodevelopmental conditions

# New keyworkers service in Brighton & Hove

A new keyworkers service has recently launched in Brighton and Hove. It's aimed at children and young people aged 0 to 25 who are autistic or have a learning disability, who are at risk of mental health hospital admission or are already in an inpatient setting.

# **Latest from the Speech and Language Therapy service**

The Speech and Language Therapy Service in Brighton & Hove is welcoming **new speech and language therapists** into the service this term. They will be working with children and young people with speech, language and communication needs in mainstream schools.

The service is currently hosting four **speech and language therapy students** on their clinical placements, providing valuable support for the team, with the hope that they will come back to work for the service when they have qualified.

Alongside this they are reviewing and **refreshing their website pages**, including updating their links to websites that provide parents, carers and young people with information and ideas about speech, language and

communication differences. Amaze will share their updated website on our social media when it is ready.
